# 2025 Hawks AGM Reports

## President, Shawn Melnyk

As we close out the 2024–2025 season, I’m pleased to report that this year has been one of focused rebuilding and renewed direction for the Hawks Athletics Club. Our efforts have centered around getting the organization back on strong operational and financial footing, while also enhancing the programming and support we offer to our players and families.

### **Organizational Rebuilding and Financial Oversight**

We entered this season with the goal of strengthening our internal structure and improving clarity across all areas of club operations. Financially, we took a major step forward by completing a full external audit with Metrix Group. Their review confirmed where we stood and highlighted several areas for improvement. We’ve already begun applying these learnings to ensure better long-term financial stewardship and transparency.

### **Program Development and On-Ice Growth**

This year marked our first full season of structured development sessions for U9, U11, U13, and our goaltenders. These sessions were well-received and had a positive impact on player development. While successful overall, they also provided us with valuable insights to refine and grow the program in the seasons to come.

### **Governance and External Representation**

I have continued to represent the Hawks at the broader Hockey Edmonton table throughout the year. This included participating in the U11 AA engagement sessions, attending the monthly Community Committee meetings, and taking an active role in discussions around U9 programming, boundary alignment, and the overall relationship between Hockey Edmonton and its Minor Hockey Associations.

I also attended the Hockey Edmonton AGM, where I addressed Hockey Edmonton’s \$300,000 deficit for 2023–24. I advocated for stronger leadership, improved financial responsibility, and better communication with community-level clubs like ours.

In addition, I sit as Chair of the Community Boundary Committee, working alongside other clubs to reassess how elite boundaries interact with community boundaries—particularly in light of Edmonton’s ongoing growth and the evolving makeup of our community associations from U7 to U13.

### **Northwest Zone Involvement**

This year, I have also served as the Hawks representative on the Northwest Zone board, working alongside our counterparts at Whitemud West. These monthly meetings have helped align our club with broader zone priorities and have given us a seat at the table to influence decision-making at the zone level.

### **Looking Ahead**

This season has brought real, tangible improvements to how we operate as a club—on the ice, off

the ice, and in how we govern ourselves. I'm proud of the progress we've made, and I'm energized by the momentum we've created.

As we look to the future, I will be seeking a second term as President. I remain committed to continuing this work, building stability and success for the Hawks organization and the players we serve. We will keep growing our Hawks family and, importantly, continue to support and invest in our volunteers—who are, without a doubt, the most important contributors to the success of any season.

Each year, I take the time to read every piece of annual feedback submitted. I often focus on the constructive or negative comments first to identify where we can do better. But what always stands out is how overwhelmingly positive the feedback truly is. Seeing how many families feel welcomed, supported, and connected to the Hawks community reminds me why we do this work. We're not just developing hockey players—we're creating a place where families feel at home, and that's something I will continue to prioritize in the seasons ahead.

### VP Finance

This is the first time the club has had an audited financial statement. Key highlight from the report is “emphasis of matter” saying that prior to this year they can't really speak to the opening balances. We are now officially following Canadian Accounting Standards for Non-Profits.

### Executive Director

It is difficult to summarize the last year but below is a point form list of the projects I have completed or am well into the process with.

- Launched a new website with better functionality
- Collected real Hawks images for the website and launched an automated chat feature.
- Supported monthly newsletter creation.
- Streamlined purchasing processes for things like Conditioning Camp and Oil Kings Night
- Moved all team bank accounts under one umbrella.
- Facilitated an external audit.
- Built a shared registration database for board access (Monday.com)
- Automated key admin tasks to reduce manual work.
- Game Threads - Started a jersey recycling program to clear warehouse space and reduce waste.
- Created the *Bored Siblings Club* — a fun program for kids during evaluations.
- Listened to feedback from Managers and Coaches and have created new automated training tools that will auto-send to managers each month during the season with reminders to do things such as “update your team parents on the budget and spending” and directing them to resources for tournament applications and other helpful points. The TeamSnap Manager chat this year was very active and very helpful.

### VP Hockey Ops, Quinn Carter

#### **Tiering**

- In the 2024-25 hockey season, the addition of a second tiering round, prior to playoffs, worked well for the club. Three Hawks teams (HK401, HK404, and HK503) won gold in their respective playoff tiering groups.
- Hawks Athletic Club is currently in active consultation with EFHL regarding further updates to the tiering procedures for the 2025-26 season. In addition to a second, pre-playoff tiering round, the new procedures will likely feature anonymized presentations of team data, assigned tiering committees for age categories, processes for limiting potential conflicts of interest, strength of schedule considerations, and strict timelines for requests and appeals.

## **Disputes**

- In the 2024-25 hockey season, the VP Hockey Operations served as the *de facto* disputes director for the club, and will likely continue in this role for the coming season.
- The Hawks Athletic Club is presently working with club members to develop an updated disputes policy that will align the club's dispute resolution processes with current best practices in Canadian youth sport.

## VP Evals, presented by Shawn Melnyk

- Skills development went well this year as the first year. TJ Woodward, former Hawks dad, has been contracted to run the development skates this year with the help of Hawks coaches.
- It is important for coaches to be reading the coaching manual

## U7 Director's Report, David Niven and Amy Delday

### **Registrations Overview**

Discovery: 16 players (2 teams)

Jr. Timbits: 22 players (2 teams)

Sr. Timbits: 53 players (5 teams)

This season, we introduced an option for Jr. Timbits to register with the Sr. Timbits group, allowing them an additional ice time per week. This initiative was well-received and will be offered again in the upcoming season.

### **Player Development**

- Learn to Skate: Edges provided two sessions for both Discovery and Jr. Timbits groups, helping our youngest players build foundational skating skills.
- Looking Ahead: We plan to expand our skating development program to approximately 12 weeks next season. This will not only enhance player development but also give coaches valuable time to connect with players and refine their coaching strategies.

### **Game Play & Partnerships**

We partnered with EFHA and KC for Sr. Timbits games, which proved successful. The back-to-back ice times at Castledowns Arena allowed for efficient scheduling and enjoyable inter-club play.

We will explore continuing and expanding this partnership next season, as players and coaches appreciated the opportunity to compete with other clubs.

### **Closing Remarks**

The 2024/2025 season was a strong year for our U7 program, with growth in participation and development. We're excited to build on this momentum and continue providing a fun, supportive, and skill-building environment for our young Hawks.

### **Season Highlights:**

- **Team Progression:**  
We began the season with six teams spread across Tiers 1 to 6. By season's end, three of our teams had moved up to more competitive tiers—clear evidence that our long-term development strategies are paying off.
- **Full-Ice Exhibition Series:**  
This year marked the introduction of the Full-Ice Exhibition Series, transitioning U9 play

from half-ice to full-ice. The “great full-ice debate” was a constant topic throughout the season, with many viewpoints on what’s best for our players. Despite the challenges, our coaches and players adapted with determination and enthusiasm, developing systems that kept our HAWKS both competitive and progressing.

- **Pond Hockey Extravaganza:**

A highlight of the season was the U9 Pond Hockey Extravaganza, held outdoors at Cattail Crossing during the kickoff weekend of Minor Hockey Week. Although the weather didn’t fully cooperate, the event was a memorable experience. The smiles on our players’ faces told the real story—pure joy and a love for the game.

As directors, this season was both fulfilling and rewarding. The growth we’ve seen—on and off the ice—has been truly inspiring. We are excited to see what our HAWKS will bring to the 2025/26 season!

### U11 Report, Darren Haire and Adam Ferrante

The U11 teams were tiered correctly with the exception of HK405 at the end of the season. Hockey Edmonton created a green level to tier 5 for the playoffs, and HK405 should have been there with the rest of the teams as they were competitive with throughout the regular season. They were left in blue due to the goals for and against formula that was used for tiering this past year. There will be a new formula in place for 2025/2026 that should correct this issue.

No major concerns were brought about by the evaluations.

3 of 5 teams played in the playoff finals:

HK401 – Gold

HK402 – Silver

HK404 – Gold - also won Minor Hockey week

- All the coaches received good to excellent feedback, and the U11 group as a whole did really well in 2024/2025. Coach of the year went to Bryan Bartman, coach of HK405. Great job, Bryan, fur coats for everyone.
- The head coach of HK404 also brought up an affiliation issue this year. A team from St. Albert affiliated a player to make them better instead of nee, the player was leading them in scoring as an affiliate. The issue was brought up with EFHL and Hockey Edmonton, and the player's affiliation was revoked.

### U13 Director, Jean-Marie Robert

#### 1. Evaluations

Evaluations ran smoothly this year. A lot of pressure is placed on the Directors to coordinate volunteers, player placement, evaluators, jersey cleaning, table setup, etc. The new Evaluations Coordinator will be a great help.

#### **Recommendations:**

#### **Team Formation:**

Four U13 teams were formed.

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League play revealed mixed results. While HK501–HK503 were competitive despite losing records, HK504 struggled due to the North/South tiering instead of color tiering.

**Recommendations:**

- We will have to closely monitor the tiering/re-tiering policy being implemented by EFHL. My feeling is the initial tiering will be crucial. It might be better to “under-tier” the teams and request to be moved up, rather than “over-tiering” and hoping the teams get pushed down.
- We have to closely monitor our evaluations and see if we have a true tier 1 team this season. We’ve had 2 seasons in a row with struggling tier 1 teams. We especially need to be mindful of our goalie numbers and caliber.

**Operational Challenges:**

- **Practice Ice:** As with all HE associations, there is an acute practice ice shortage.
- **Behavioral Incidents:** This season proved challenging with U13 parents exhibiting improper behavior. We will have to reiterate and reinforce the importance of the fair play pledge.
- **Team Budgets:** We received some parent concerns regarding the team budgets. As of June, only 2 of the 4 teams had closed their accounts. As of June 25, we still have one team with an open account. Next season we will have to enforce better team budget communication to ensure transparency.
- **EFHL Suspensions:** There were some issues this season with suspension reporting by the EFHL. The U13 director will have to closely monitor suspension notifications.

**Conclusion:**

I am looking forward to next season.

Equipment Report, Stephanie Malay

It’s been a great hockey season for the Hawks! Here’s a summary of our equipment updates, needs, and plans going forward:

**Equipment Updates**

- **Training Equipment:** This past year, we focused on purchasing additional training equipment to support player development.
- **Shooting Targets:** We purchased 12 metal shooting targets, which will be available for teams to use in the upcoming season.

**Returns & Condition Updates**

- **Gear Returns:** All equipment gear, jerseys, and shells have been returned.
- **White U13 Jerseys:** These are in rough shape and will need replacement.
- **U9 Goalie Gear:** The current sets are very worn and outdated.

**Upcoming Orders & Needs**

- **New Jerseys:** Additional white U13 jerseys will be ordered.
- **Evaluation Jerseys:** A few more numbered jerseys for evaluations will also be ordered.
- **Weighted Pylons:** We are running low due to some being misplaced. These will need to be re-ordered.
- **U9 Goalie Gear:** 12 new sets of goalie gear will be purchased and included in the budget. Note: Neck guards have already been purchased and are not required at this time.
- **U7 timbits jerseys, socks and medals** will be ordered when the link is open. We will look into ordering 14 jerseys per team.

**Budget**

- A budget was created and approved based on these 2025-2026 identified equipment needs.

- Jerseys are not currently included in this approved budget, as Sarah is exploring options and making final decisions regarding suppliers.

#### **Next Steps**

- Inventory Date: We need to set a date for a full equipment inventory.
- Categorization: Assistance will be needed to help Sarah categorize and organize the equipment during inventory.

#### **Leadership Transition**

This will be my final meeting as Equipment Director, as I will be stepping down from the role. Please join me in welcoming Brianna Miniaci, who will be taking over as our new Equipment Director. Brianna has already been a great help during gear return and is starting to get familiar with the responsibilities of the role. I'll be available to support her during the transition and answer any questions she may have.
